WAPA Office Closures for D. Hamilton Jackson Day, Election Day and Veterans Day

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS (October 30, 2024) - The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority ("WAPA" or the "Authority") advises the public that the Customer Service and Business offices territory-wide will be closed on Friday, November 1, 2024, in observance of D. Hamilton Jackson Day, traditionally known as "Bull and Bread Day," and on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, for Election Day, Offices will also be closed territory-wide in observance of Veterans Day on November 11, 2024.

Bull and Bread Day marks an important celebration of Jackson's enduring legacy as a champion for freedom, equality, and the rights of Virgin Islanders. We join the community in honoring his contributions and encourage everyone to reflect on the impact of his work as a prominent labor leader, educator, newspaper editor and advocate for civil rights in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

About WAPA: The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority is an autonomous agency of the Virgin Islands Government which produces and distributes electricity and drinking water to residential and commercial customers in the territory. WAPA was created by the Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands in 1964 through Act No. 1248. Today, WAPA generates electrical power at production plants on St. Thomas and St. Croix and distributes electrical service through smart grids to customers on St. Thomas, St. Croix, St. John, Hassel Island, and Water Island. Potable water is distributed to almost 13,000 customers through water lines and standpipes. WAPA also has the responsibility of installing and maintaining streetlights.
