Saturday Electrical Interruption Scheduled for Feeders 1A and 2A on St. Croix

St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands (December 4, 2025) — The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority ("WAPA" or "the Authority") is advising the public of a scheduled electrical service interruption on Feeders 1A and 2A on Saturday, December 6, from 12:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

Approximately 1,020 customers on Feeder 1A and 3,005 customers on Feeder 2A will be affected in the following areas:

Christiansted Town, Hotel on the Cay, De Chabert Housing, Richmond, Pink Fancy Hotel, Water Gut, D.H. Jackson Terrace, WJKC, All for the Better, Anna's Hope, Castle Nugent, Coakley Bay, Cotton Valley, Eliza's Retreat, Gallows Bay, Lowry Hill, Marienhoj, Union Mt. Washington, Sally's Fancy, Solitude, Southgate, Southside of Christiansted Town, Tipperary, Turner's Hole, Richmond, Welcome – Tide Village, WJKC Radio Transmitter, and WSTX Studios.

This planned outage will give contractors time to safely make roof repairs near Crucian Gold, while WAPA crews carry out important maintenance on power equipment for downtown customers.

WAPA encourages affected customers to plan accordingly and appreciates the community's understanding as crews complete these necessary improvements safely and efficiently.

About WAPA: The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority is an autonomous agency of the Virgin Islands Government which produces and distributes electricity and drinking water to residential and commercial customers in the territory. WAPA was created by the Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands in 1964 through Act No. 1248. Today, WAPA generates electrical power at production plants on St. Thomas and St. Croix and distributes electrical service through smart grids to customers on St. Thomas, St. Croix, St. John, Hassel Island, and Water Island. Potable water is distributed to almost 13,000 customers through water lines and standpipes. WAPA also has the responsibility of installing and maintaining streetlights.
