The Alva C. McFarlane Scholarship offers substantial financial aid to students pursuing careers in these critical areas:

- Bachelor's Degrees: Up to \$80,000 in funding
- Associate's/Technical Degrees: Up to \$30,000 in funding

WAPA encourages all eligible students to apply before the **February 28, 2025,** deadline. Applications can be submitted online via the <u>online portal</u>. Today, WAPA generates electrical power at production plants on St. Thomas and St. Croix and distributes electrical service through smart grids to customers on St. Thomas, St. Croix, St. John, Hassel Island, and Water Island. Potable water is distributed to almost 13,000 customers through water lines and standpipes. WAPA also has the responsibility of installing and maintaining streetlights.
