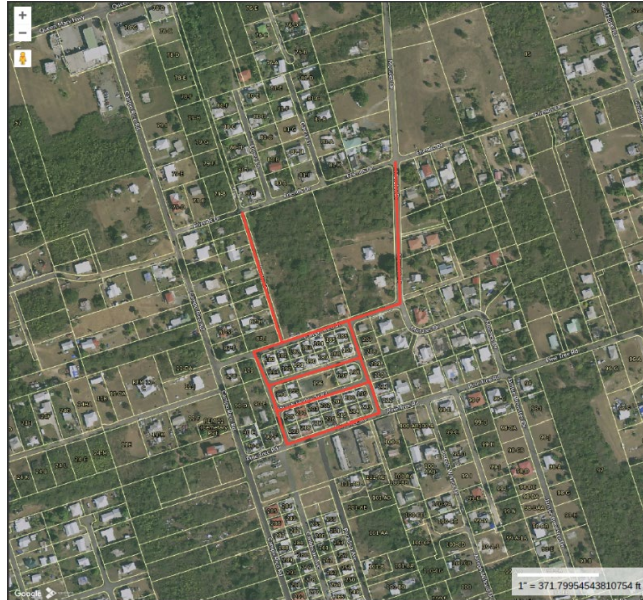

## Scheduled Temporary Water Outage in Campo Rico Tomorrow

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS (November 14, 2024) – The Virgin Islands Water & Power Authority (“WAPA” or the “Authority”) is informing customers of a scheduled water outage in Campo Rico (Whim), St. Croix tomorrow, Friday, November 15, 2024. This temporary interruption is necessary to complete a tie-in for the Campo Rico Waterline Rehabilitation Project.

Water service will be temporarily unavailable starting at 9:00 a.m. and is expected to last approximately two hours. During this time, all customers located adjacent to the red line on the map will be affected.

As a reminder, after an extended water outage, please flush your water lines by running your tap for several minutes. To extend the life of your filter, remove it before flushing and reinstall it afterward. This process helps clear sediment that may have been stirred up during restoration and ensures the continued quality of your water.

We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we carry out essential upgrades to support a more resilient water system for our community.

**About WAPA:** The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority is an autonomous agency of the Virgin Islands Government which produces and distributes electricity and drinking water to residential and commercial customers in the territory. WAPA was created by the Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands in 1964 through Act No. 1248. Today, WAPA generates electrical power at production plants on St. Thomas and St. Croix and distributes electrical service through smart grids to customers on St. Thomas, St. Croix, St. John, Hassel Island, and Water Island. Potable water is distributed to almost 13,000 customers through water lines and standpipes. WAPA also has the responsibility of installing and maintaining streetlights.
